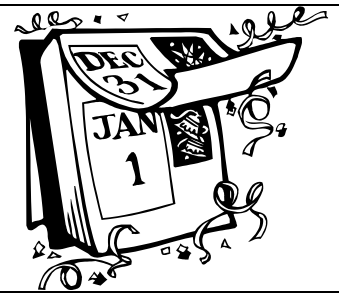

The Crisis Nursery would appreciate these types of items:

- Children clothing (especially ages 8-12 years)
- Fall/Winter clothing/jackets/snow suits etc.
- Garbage bags (small and large household and outdoor)
- Freezer bags, Plastic sealable lunch and snack bags
- Cleaning supplies -Windex, Mr. Clean, Bleach, Dish soap, Dish washer detergent, liquid hand soap, Liquid fabric softener (unscented), HE laundry detergent (unscented)
- Medical supplies (Band-aids, Children's Tylenol or Advil, Gripe Water ect)
- Lice Treatment Supplies (ex. R&C solution)
- Hair detangler, Children body wash
- Fresh Produce & meats (frozen)
- Grocery store gift cards (to purchase fruits, breads, vegetables, etc)
- Non latex disposable gloves
- Stamps, blue & red pens

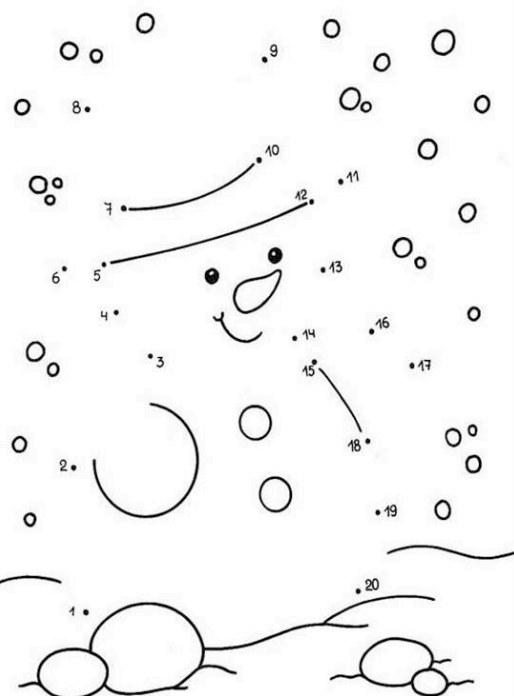
